

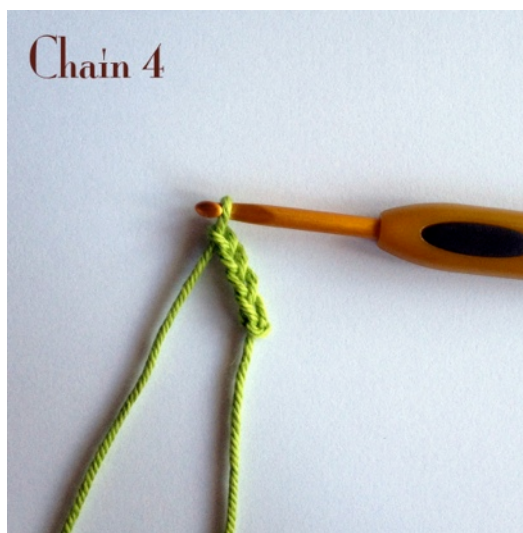
HOW TO MAKE A MULTI COLOUR, TRADITIONAL GRANNY SQUARE

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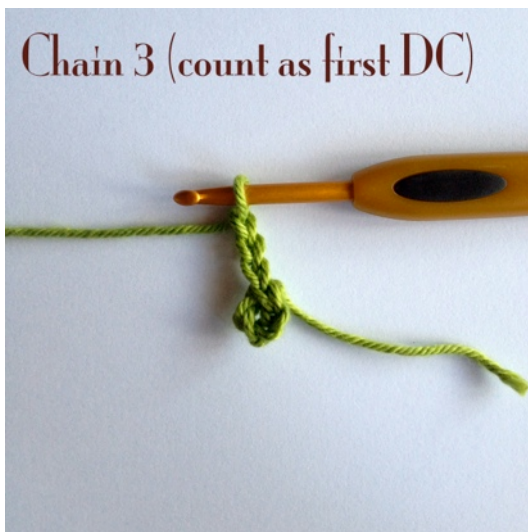
Once you've made your first granny square, you'll be hooked on crochet. A granny square is what crochet is all about: easy to learn and quick to do, with lots of room to personalise and play.



Written in US crochet terms.



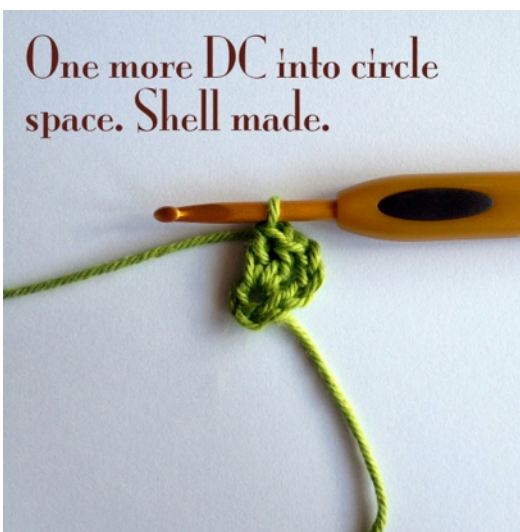
Chain 3 (count as first DC)



DC into circle space



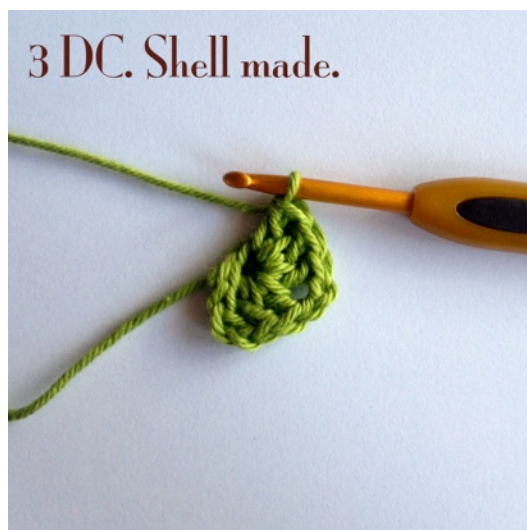
One more DC into circle space. Shell made.



Chain 2. Corner made.



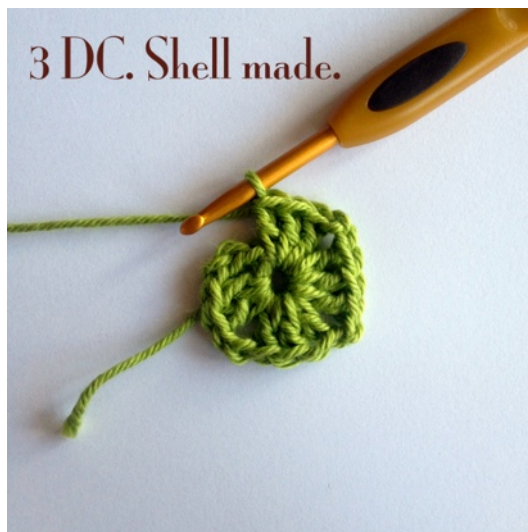
3 DC. Shell made.



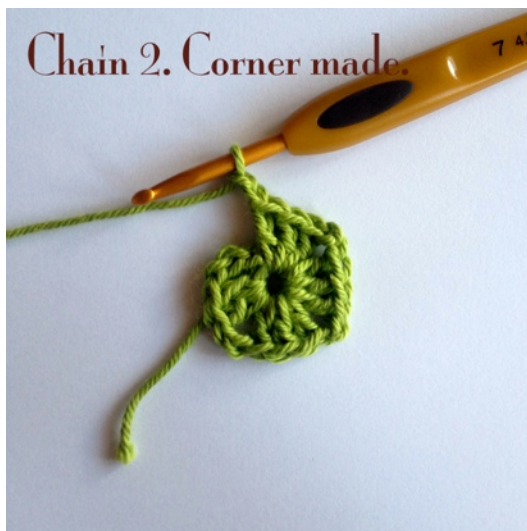
Chain 2. Corner made.



3 DC. Shell made.

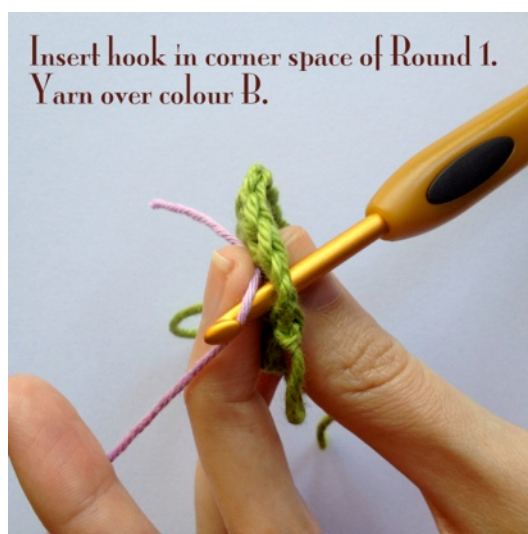


Chain 2. Corner made.



Slip stitch into 3rd (top) chain of starting chain.





Pull up colour B, keeping your finger on the tail at the back of square.



Chain 1, still keeping finger on the tail at back of square.



Bring the tail over your working yarn.



Chain 1. (Two chains made). The tail is now caught within the second chain stitch.



Chain 1. (Three chains made. Counts as first DC of Shell)



Tail over working yarn.





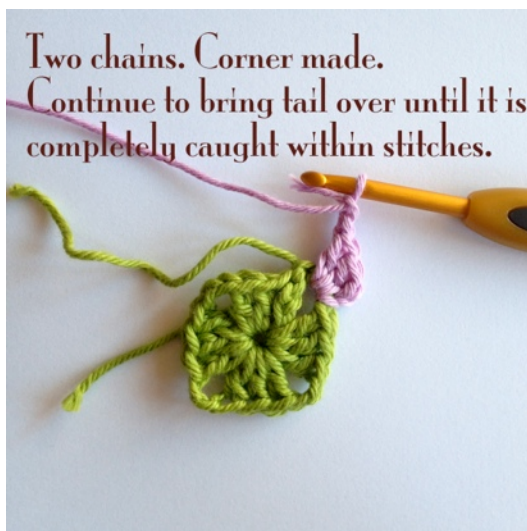
After first Yarn Over of second DC, bring tail over working yarn.



Complete DC (two DC made). Tail over working again.



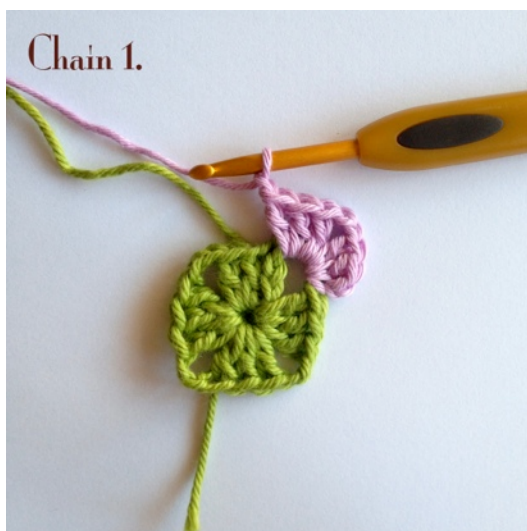
Two chains. Corner made. Continue to bring tail over until it is completely caught within stitches.



3 DC. Shell + 2 chain + Shell =
Corner Shell.



Chain 1.



3 DC (Shell) in corner space of
Round 1.



Chain 2. Corner made.



Shell in corner space of Round 1.
Corner Shell made.



Chain 1.



Corner Shell in corner space of Round 1.



Continue to work Corner Shell in corner spaces of Round 1, each seperated by 1 Chain.



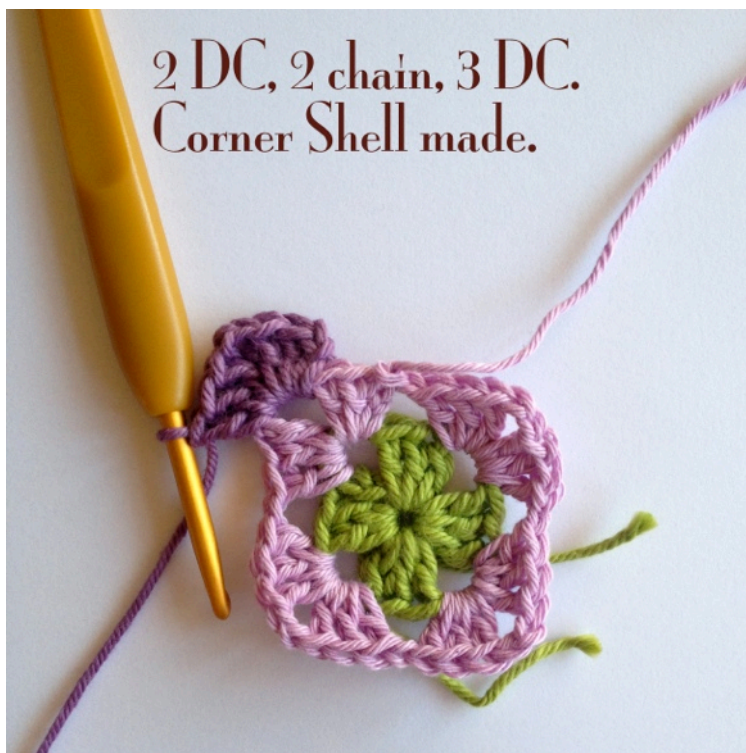
Slip stitch into 3rd (top) chain of starting chain. Fasten off Colour B.

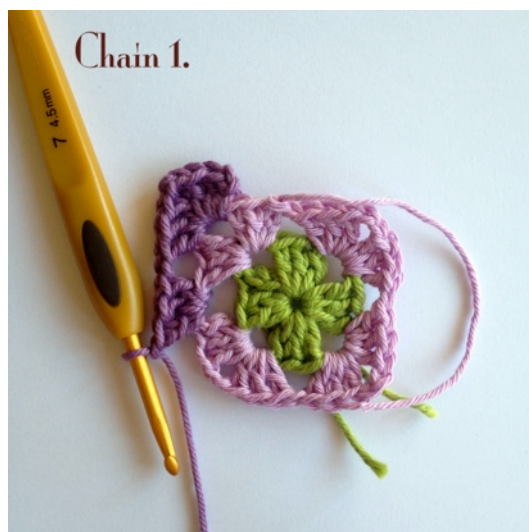
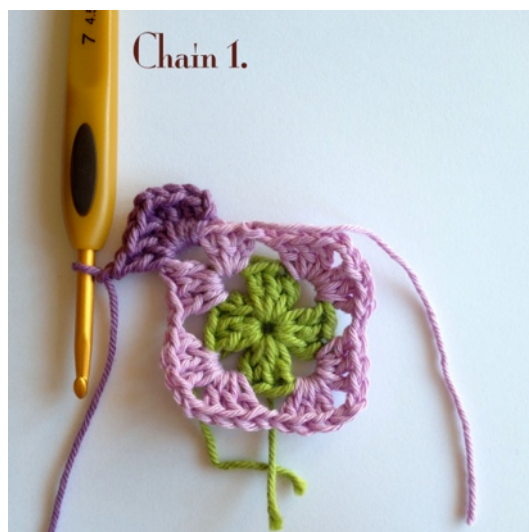


Join Colour C in corner space of Round 2. Chain 3. Counts as DC. Catch tail in chain stitches as for Colour B.



2 DC, 2 chain, 3 DC.
Corner Shell made.



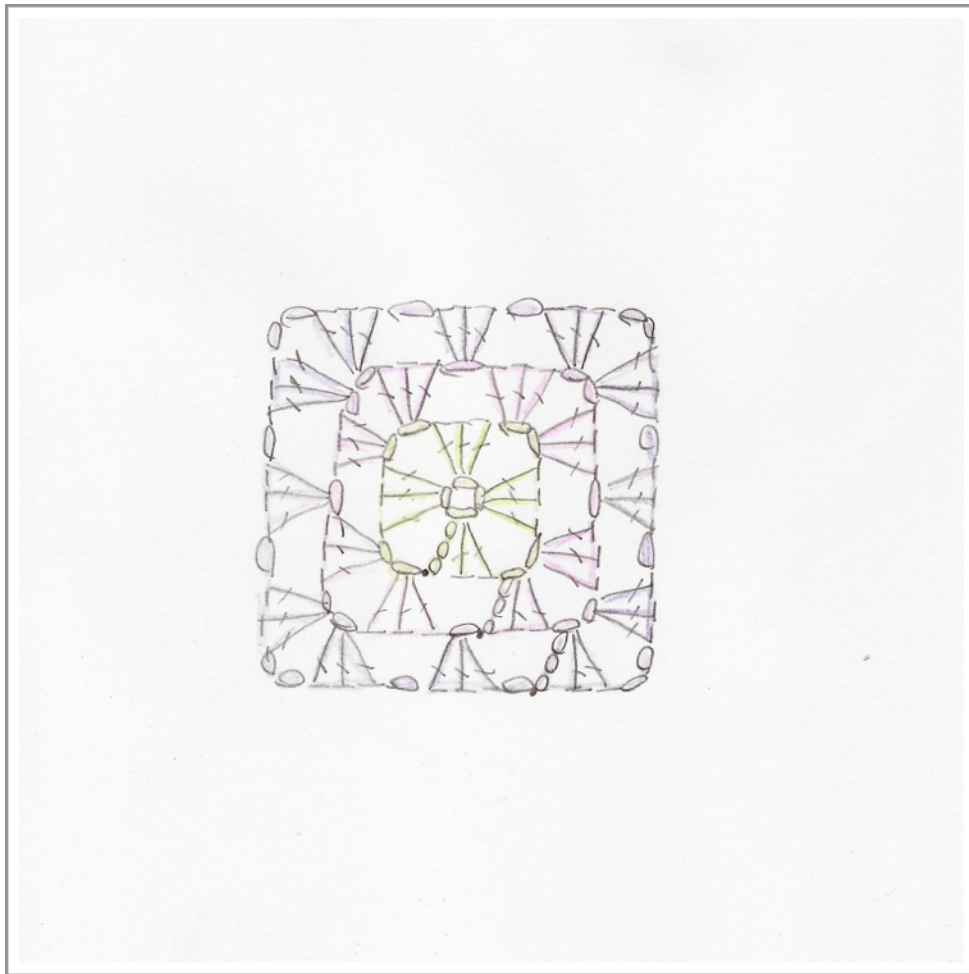


Continue making Corner Shells in corner spaces and Shells in chain spaces of Round 2, each Shell separated by 1 chain.



Slip stitch into 3rd (top) chain of starting chain. Fasten off.





In UK crochet patterns, the Double Crochet (DC) will be called a Treble (TR). However, the symbol for a Double Crochet / Treble in a crochet diagram looks the same.

Note: If your square is going to have 5 or more rounds, I suggest alternating the corners in which you join the new yarn. If new colour joins are not spaced evenly all the way around the square, it could slant to one side as it's "heavier" on that side from all the new joins.
